Call for Papers: MigRom Final Conference

Abstracts are invited for presentations at the MigRom final conference, to take place in Manchester, UK, on 17-19 January 2017. We are seeking papers that address any of the following themes in relation to the East-West migration of Roma: Spatial and social mobility, notions of community and inclusion, social change, external perception and interaction with institutions and media, policy and public debates, self-reliance and participation.

Twelve papers will be selected for presentation by a panel of the MigRom consortium. Authors of the selected presentations will receive full accommodation and board at the conference venue and partial reimbursement of travel expenses.

Abstracts of up to 400 words plus references, along with a one-page CV, should be sent to the MigRom project manager, Charlotte Jones [charlotte.jones@manchester.ac.uk] by **30 May 2016**.

MigRom ('The immigration of Romanian Roma to Western Europe: Causes, effects, and future engagement strategies') is a collaborative research project funded by the European Union under the Seventh Framework Programme call on 'Dealing with diversity and cohesion: the case of the Roma in the European Union' (GA319901). The project was launched in 2013 and includes the consortium partners University of Manchester (coordinator), University of Granada, Fondation Maison des Sciences de l'Homme, University of Verona, Romanian Institute for Research on National Minorities, Manchester City Council, and European Roma and Travellers Forum. During its lifetime the consortium engaged over 40 staff members. Over 50 academic output publications have so far appeared in print, and more are in preparation. The project included an outreach and public engagement agenda, co-designed and delivered by participating members of Roma communities in partnership with local authorities.
